Objectives of the Programme:

Day 1: 06/03/2022

- Arrival at Hyderabad Airport and transit to the hotel took almost the first half of the day.
- After settling into the hotel, the group went to visit the Historical site of Char Minar which was indeed an enriching experience.
- Latter half of the evening was spent at Hussain Sagar Lake

Day 2: 07/03/2022

- The scheduled visit commenced at a high note of a warm welcome by the facilitator staff.
- We were divided into 2 groups to silently observe how kids are learning in a different environment- Primary and Elementary
- While silently observing the activities, I was astounded to see how self-paced peer learning
 was happening and teachers were adding just some amount of guided enquiry.
- A very striking difference is that kids call the teachers "Aunty" to feel more connected and school is called "environment" rather than school.
- At 12:15 pm, we had a lively discourse with the kids and what they like about their "environment".
- It was so wonderful to see that kids of age groups 10 (5-6th grade) years were learning, doing and addressing the curriculum of 10th graders.
- It was also wonderful to see how presentations by elder kids influence the learning of younger kids- really good role modeling. For interaction a presentation on Biography of Ambedkar led them to learning about Columbia and its dance.



Day 3: 08/03/2022

- Visited the primary wing of Cremon Montessori today in the first half.
- Students had made some beautiful cards, calendars and bookmarks for all of us.
- They presented a short cultural programme. The whole group was invigorated with the enthusiasm shown by the kids and participated in the activity along with the kids.
- During lunch time, teachers arranged for a fruit party for the kids as requested by us.
- Later the staff made presentations regarding their pedagogies group wise. Various TLMs were shown and their use was discussed along with short demonstrations of the same by teachers and a few students too.
- We shared various interventions of the Delhi Government briefly and presented a wooden embossed painting as a token of our gratitude.







Day 4: 09/03/2022

The day started with an introductory tour of the premises which was facilitated by 2-3 students of the Akshara Vanam. Post the tour a brief introductory session was taken by Sripati Reddy to acquaint us to the basic idea behind "Swadhayay". A few interventions that make the system stand apart

- Learning approach is of Language, logic and life-skills
- Collaborative peer learning
- 40 different sets for paper used each time to zero down the probability of copying from a peer.
- Question paper made and given to each other also simplification done if couldn't understand
- Behavioral change is the major aspect that is sought in a child. The idea that we learn from mistakes this attitude is quite commendable.
- Vestibule training to prepare a child for life with hands-on experience was impressive.
- The basic idea revolves around Holistic education that starts with logical mathematical learning and enjoying the process. Self-dependence and logical reasoning is sought in the child.

It was wonderful to see that the students themselves are managing the whole set-up starting from infrastructure to animals, kitchen and cleaning of the premises, Not only this even the learning was

managed by the students only. They made the question papers, discussed them and also edited them accordingly.

- In the later half district collector visited and we shared our experiences at Akshara Vanam.
- A few suggestions were also shared by us in brief along with various interventions of the Delhi Government.
- In the evening the students presented a cultural program.
- Post dinner a BAL SABHA was held by the kids.
 Overall, it was an absolutely invigorating experience

LifeSkills

Life Skills are given more importance at Akshara Vanam Children ...

- Clean their surroundings including the toilets
- Cook for nearly 80 100 people every day
- Manage the goshala on their own
- Do farming of vegetables and fruits
- Do plumbing, electrical and machine repair works
- Give each other haircuts also!
- Can learn more than 115 kills at Akshara Vanam

The <u>chef assessmentdesigned by the children</u> is an example of the measurement of non-academic skills.





Day 6: 11/03/2022

• The day started with a short introduction to Physics and chemistry courses pedagogic tools used. We saw and discussed the assessments used for the same.

• Later a few of us gave individual interviews of our experience at Akshara Vanam and how we perceive to take it to our educational experience and employ it in our set-up.

Post lunch, we headed off back to Hyderabad.





Day 7: 12/03/2022

- Most of the group members visited Ramoji Film city.
- A few of the Mentor Teachers visited Aranya Permaculture in the outskirts of the city to develop an understanding of how just providing the right amount of moisture and taking care of the vegetation in its natural surroundings can work wonders and produce huge outputs.
 We saw trees laden with Sapotas, custard apples, Jackfruits and mangoes. Sandalwood, tendu, reetha, bamboo trees were gracing the farm. It was told to us by our host Ms. Sneha that all the fruit and these trees were sprouted straight from bird droppings and they hadn't planted them artificially.

The whole excursion was indeed an awesome learning experience. Looking forward to more of similar experiences.
