Word Processing Guidelines

All articles (including tables and figures) must fit within size A4 paper and be in portrait orientation.

Title and Authors

The title (Times New Roman 14-point bold, Uppercase), authors' names (Times New Roman 12-point bold) and authors' affiliation (Times New Roman 10-point, italics) must be according to the given format. Authors **need not** mention their designations.

Page Numbering, Headers and Footers

Do not include headers, footers or page numbers in your submission. These will be added when the publications are assembled.

Responsibility of Authors

Authors are solely responsible for the factual accuracy of their contributions. The author is responsible for obtaining permission to quote lengthy excerpts from previously published material. All figures and tables must be included within the document.

Figures/Captions

Place Tables/Figures/Images in text as close to the reference as possible. Captions should be Times New Roman 12-point bold. They should be numbered (e.g., "Table 1" or "Figure 2"), please note that the word for Table and Figure are spelled out. Figure's captions should be centered beneath the image or picture, and Table captions should be centered above the table body.

References

The references must be in the APA format.
