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Educational exposure provides unique opportunities for teachers to continue to craft their teaching practice. The inclusion of immersive experiences allows teachers to broaden the scope of their syllabus and utilize different teaching styles and strategies whilst being in a targeted environment. SCERT Delhi has taken consistent initiative to promote such strategies & organised national exposure visit of Primary In-charges of DoE, GNCT Delhi to Sikkim one of the fastest growing, multi-ethnic and multilingual Indian state from 18th December to 24th December 2022, to provide an opportunity to the In-charges to discuss and learn from the experiences of prominent academicians, school heads, etc. and observe and reflect their methodologies to enhance teaching and learning. During this national exposure visit, the Primary In-charges had the chance to visit Sikkim schools. Through discussions with HoS, teachers, students and observation of their classroom and extracurricular activities, they were able to comprehend a lot about the role of good teachers. The Exposure Visit gave the Primary In-charges of the Directorate of Education, Delhi excellent learning opportunities. The whole idea behind the trip was to acquaint the Primary In-charges with innovative and alternative models and practices of classroom teaching in followed by Sikkim Government, and also to increase their motivation and enthusiasm.



Day1(19th December2022)

Learning is a continuous process, everyday experiences teach us new concepts. It is the natural fact that something that is seen in real can be easily perceived than something that we simply read in a book and memorize theoretically. Also, practical learning stays longer in our mind. Early morning we went to Tiger Hill (2590 m) to witness the spectacular sunrise over Mt. Kanchenjunga, the world's 3rd highest peak and visited Himalayan Institute of Mountaineering, a world premier institute in Darjeeling. Group captain and Principal of the institute Shri Jai Kishan extended warm welcome to the group arranged a small show on Mission Antatica and oriented group about various courses being run by them. We visited Ghoom monastery we had a glimpse of a few local birds which again mesmerized all of us with a blend of colours and unique beauty. As we reached Ghoom monastery, the serenity of the holy place with mantras and chants was inexplicable. Afterwards, we visited War Memorial- Batasia Loop dedicated to the soldiers of 1995. We paid homage to the sacrifices of brave soldiers. We also experienced the cultural aspect with vibrant traditional dresses and jewellery. Then the group visited the places like Tea Gardens, Tenzing Rock and Peace Pagoda which are the best examples in their respective fields. Tenzing rock is the place for the learning of mountaineering and Peace Pagoda is the holy place of Buddhism.



Day2(20th December2022)

The team visited Govt.Co.Ed.Secondary school, District Namchi, Sikkim. Mr.SonamWangchuk, Principal of the school extended warm welcome to our group and during his interaction with our group in a class room as well as in assembly ground with students;Principal appreciated the effort of Hon'ble C.M. and Hon'bleDy.C.M. in the area of education and praised the education model of Delhi govt.. Principal also shared the good practices being followed in Sikkim Govt.schools with our group members. Our group member also interacted with students, faculty and shared various initiatives of GNCT of Delhi in Delhi Govt.schools with them. The group also visited Namchi Char Dham which is a huge (29 hectares) pilgrimage & cultural complex developed by the Sikkim Government on the top of Solophok hill in Namchi, South Sikkim, to promote religious, eco & village tourism in the state.



Day3(21th December2022)

The group visited Tsomgo Lake in East Sikkim, Baba Harbhajan Singh Temple and Nathula pass border area. The lake give us feel of beauty of the nature, the baba Ji's temple built in memory of brave soldier of the nation shriHarbhjan Singh ji posted at this border area is an example of high sacrifice for the nation. Spending moments at NathulaPass border area between India and China at 14500 height gives us heart touching feel of Josh is high and reminds us about the real feel and touch of Deshbhakti
